The legs (16 x 14.5") taper subtly and flare outward, giving the form stability and an easy stance, while the lower stretchers reinforce the frame without adding weight or visual bulk.

The pine shows a clear, honest patina: small marks, darker knots, and scattered wear that speak to decades of use without compromising solidity. It's the kind of straightforward English piece that works anywhere—bathroom, kitchen, entry, or as a plant stand—because the proportions are slim, the build is sturdy, and the look stays quietly authentic.
